
OUR MEMBERS:

SATRA CELEBRATES 75 YEARS IN BUSINESS

SATRA Footwear Technology Centre, based at Kettering UK, is one of the world's leading footwear research organisations. This vear it celebrates 75 years in business and has over 1100 member companies in more than 50 countries. It employs over 150 scientists, technicians and support staff.

SATRA played an important part in the setting up of UI-TIC and SATRA officials have served on our Executi-Committee over the years.

John Bunten, former Research Superintendent at SATRA, was a long standing member of UITIC and became our President for 1981-83. SATRA Chief Executive Dr Ron Whittaker during his spell on our Committee provided great help in organising our conferences on new technology. Peter Perkins, an Assistant Director at SATRA, has now taken on this role. SATRA made a major contribution to the organisation of the UITIC conference in 1979 which was held in Bristol, UK.

Royal visit

SATRA's 75th anniversary was marked by a royal visit - from HRH The Duke of Edinburgh - who opened a new £500,000 laboratory and office block, naming it "The Edinburgh Building". It houses two conditioning rooms which allow SATRA to test to the latest European and other standards.

A heavy investment has also been made in equipment for

a refurbished instrumental analysis laboratory, which is currently carrying out research into footwear materials discolouration and the causes of odour in shoes.

The Finished Product Area laboratories have also been upgraded and the new facilities are being used for a major study of the factors footwear that affect comfort.

Besides running its own extensive research and testing facilities, SATRA also sells test equipment so that companies can carry out their own quality checks. Last year sales of test equipment were greater than ever before - underlining the importance of quality in today's footwear markets.

Having a worldwide membership means that SATRA staff travel extensively

each year technical personnel spend more than 1000 days overseas on consultanand marketing as-SATRA matesignments. rials and information management systems - SATRA-Summ, SATRAData, VisionStitch and SATRAScope are now installed in over 250 companies in all parts of the globe.

Last year SATRA's turnover topped £4 million for the first time. Its strength is a reflection of the firm foundation laid by the pioneers 75 years ago. They identified three clear directions in which the trade needed to apply scientific development:

- Gaining full knowledge of materials used
- Keeping abreast of shoemaking processes
- Improving education in the trade.

Significantly, these are still recognised as key objectives
